

Crochet Mimosa Flower

Materials

- DK or light worsted yarn
 - Yellow (flowers)
 - Green/Yellow (stem)
- 2.5–3.5 mm crochet hook
- Floral wire or pipe cleaner
- Yarn needle
- Scissors



Abbreviations

- ch – chain
- dc – double crochet
- htr – half treble
- tr – treble
- sl st – slip stitch

💛 Mimosa Flower Balls

(Make 8–15 per stem)

1. Make a **magic ring**
2. Ch 1, **10 dc into ring**
3. Pull tight to form a small round ball
4. Sl st into first dc
5. Fasten off, leaving a **long tail** for sewing



Tip:

For extra fluffy flowers, gently brush finished balls with a pet slicker brush.

 **Stem**

1. Cut floral wire to desired length
2. Attach green/yellow yarn with a slip knot
3. **Dc tightly around the wire**, covering it completely
4. Fasten off

 **Assembly**

1. Arrange yellow balls along the **top third of the stem**
2. Sew on in **small, uneven clusters**
3. Allow some flowers to sit higher than others for a natural look
4. Wrap a few stitches of green yarn around the base of the cluster to blend into the stem

 **Notes**

- Mimosa flowers grow in **loose clusters**, not evenly spaced
- Bare stems look most realistic
- Multiple stems together make a beautiful bouquet
